Mr. Bynum,

The OCD has approved the Site Characterization and Remediation Plan for incident # NRM1933138367 BILLIKEN 6 FED #1H @ 30-015-42685 with the following conditions of approval:

- The Depth to groundwater has been inadequately assessed. When nearby wells are used to determine depth to groundwater, the wells should be no further than ½ mile away from the site, and data should be no more than 25 years old, and well construction information should be provided. If Devon believes that groundwater is > 100', a borehole will need to be drilled onsite and a copy of the driller's log must be provided. If Devon chooses not to drill a borehole to confirm the depth to groundwater, the site must be delineated/remediated to meet the Closure Criteria in Table 1 for groundwater at a depth of 50 feet or less.
- The proposed sampling plan is not approved. Per rule 19.15.29.14.A **Variances**: The variance request must include:
 - (1) a detailed statement explaining the need for a variance; and
 - (2) a detailed written demonstration that the variance will provide equal or better protection of fresh water, public health and the environment.
