We measured the excavated areas with a distance wheel yesterday. As shown on the attached map, excavated areas by Talon are 60x40', 10x30' and 15x5'. 2775 sq. ft.

The southeast corner of the well pad was initially sampled on 6/26/20 (samples S-4 thru S-7). The analytical results did not warrant remedial actions. Therefore confirmation samples were not taken from this area as we did not excavate here.
