
Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.*

Flowback Operators were onsite working on well when they observed a small fire by beside the completions flare. The fire was immediately extinguished by the Flowback Operators. Upon further investigation, it was discovered that the line had frozen due to cold temperatures and a small amount of condensate and methanol in the line exited the flare. Flowback Operators are now monitoring condensate levels in the knockouts. Trap drains and additional piping were installed on all temporary flares.

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.*

The affected area was around the base of the flare in a 5'x10' area. The affected area will be scraped and a confirmation sample will be taken and analyzed.
