Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.*☐ A driver error during truck load/unload resulted in the release of approximately 51 barrels of crude oil in the lined containment. A vac truck was immediately called to location and recovered approximately 40 barrels of fluid. Talon mobilized personnel for an initial site assessment the same day.

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.*

The impacted gravel/soil on top of the liner was hand shoveled into a backhoe bucket and stockpiled on plastic. Peat moss and absorbent pads was used to recover any existing fluids from on top of the liner and around the bottom of tanks. A liner assessment was conducted and concluded that the liner maintained integrity. A total of 45 tons of impacted material was transported to Lea Land LLC. No further actions are required.
