On behalf of Chevron Environmental Management Company (CEMC), Arcadis U.S., Inc. (Arcadis) prepared this Site Deferral Request (Request) for the Carrasco 14 Well No. 2, API No. 30-015-26293, located in Eddy County, New Mexico. Rockcliff Operating New Mexico LLC (Rockcliff), the previous owner of this well, was notified by the New Mexico Oil Conservation District (NMOCD) of a staining violation dated December 6, 2017 during an inspection (iTM1734047745) by NMOCD. No response to this violation has been located. The purpose of this request is for written confirmation of deferral from the NMOCD.

SITE DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND

The Site is located approximately two (2) miles east of Loving, New Mexico. The site is in Unit G, Section 14, Township 23S, Range 28E, Eddy County, New Mexico, on private land.

On December 6, 2017, during a routine inspection (iTM1734047745) conducted by NMOCD, staining was observed around the well. A letter of violation was issued to Rockcliff. No response to this violation has been located. Chevron acquired the lease for this well in October 2018.

This well is planned for plugging and abandonment. Site restoration activities will be conducted in conjunction with abandonment. Therefore, deferral of
