DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

In accordance with notice filed April 10, 1951, and your concurrence April 17, 1951, the above well was selectively treated on July 18 and 19, 1951, with Dowell 15% acid with surface tension reducer and anti-swelling additive, in intervals 3384 to 3410 and 3354 to 3380. The intervals were chosen on the basis of caliper and permeability surveys. 2500 gallons of acid was used in each zone. Average production immediately before treatment was about 16 barrels of oil per day flowing. Production after treatment 16 barrels of oil per day flowing - no improvement.
