Pursuant to our conversation on November 13, 1959, you are hereby allowed until January 15, 1960, to either reacquire the subject well and resume active operations or to plug it.

I would like to make it entirely clear that no further extensions will be granted. We always hesitate to order a well permanently plugged where there is a reasonable probability that active operations will be resumed in the near future. However, the notice of intention to plug the subject well was filed on July 2, 1952.
