The New Mexico Wilderness Commission is a public body created by the New Mexico Legislature in 1980. The Commission is composed of seven members, three appointed by the Governor and four appointed by the Legislature. The Commission's mandate is to identify and recommend areas for wilderness preservation in New Mexico. The Commission has been successful in recommending several areas for wilderness preservation, including the San Juan Mountains, the Sangre de Cristo Mountains, and the Gila National Forest. The Commission is currently reviewing a list of potential wilderness areas and will submit recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature in the near future.
