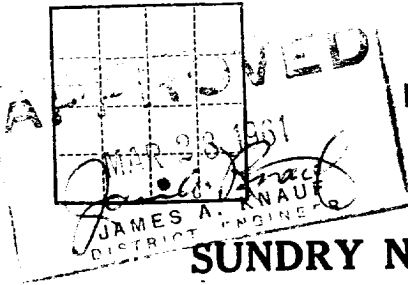

Ran magnetometer. Got 5-1/2" casing at 6910'. Pulled 6948' of 5-1/2" casing. Spotted 30 sacks cement at 4523' thru tubing. Checked top of cement plug at 4400'. Pulled tubing. Spotted 25' cement plug in top of 5-1/2" casing to surface. Placed marker and abandoned well. Location ready for inspection.
