On 10/11/93, we set 4300' of 8 5/8" intermediate casing in an 11" open hole. The casing was cemented to surface with the following cement slurries:

1250 sx LITE (35:65) + 6% ge1 + 5 lb/sk salt + 1/4 lb/sk cellophane flakes (Slurry weight = 12.7 ppg, slurry yield = 2.0 cft/sk)

200 sx Class "C" + 2% CaCl2 + 1/4 lb/sk cellophane flakes (Slurry weight = 14.8 ppg, slurry yield = 1.32 cft/sk)

We circulated 90 sacks of cement to surface. WOC time = 24 hours.
