12. Other information

- 1. Topography: The project area is situated on the first erosional terrace of Dark Canyon Draw with the access road crossing a second erosional terrace to a plain of loamy soils with slight slope to the north.
- 2. Soil: Loamy, deep soils and soils that are shallow to caliche; from old alluvium.
- 3. Flora and Fauna: The vegetation cover is variable from approximately 5% to 30% and consists primarily of tar bush, cresote, prickly pear cactus and various grasses.
- 4. Ponds and streams: There are no rivers, streams, lakes or ponds in the area.
- 5. Residences and Other Structures: Residence approximately 4,600' to the East.
- 6. Archaeological, Historical and Cultural Sites: Cultural resources have been recorded in the area. Geo-Marine Inc. has completed an archaeological report of the work area, see attached exhibit "A"
- 7. Land Use: Grazing
- 8. The well site, if a producer, will be maintained and kept clean of all trash and litter which detracts from the surrounding environment. Equipment will be maintained in accordance with good operating practice.
- 9. After the wellsite is cleaned and pits and sumps backfilled, any obstruction to the natural drainage will be corrected by ditching or terracing. All disturbed areas, including any access road no longer needed, will be ripped. Those areas will be reseeded with native grasses as described by BLM requirements.
