Gentlemen:

As we advised you on January 19, 1960, the subject well was plugged in violation of Commission Rules and Regulations. Further, the Commission has reason to believe that the well was not properly plugged. We made a demand on American Employers' Insurance Company under the January 19, 1960 date that the subject well be properly plugged no later than April 1, 1960.

Our records reflect that this demand has not been complied with and that no reason has been given to the Commission for this failure to meet a reasonable plugging deadline. Unless this situation is rectified in the very near future, it will be necessary for the Commission to institute legal action against American Employers' Insurance Company and to refuse henceforth to accept a plugging bond executed by this surety company.
