
Describe Cause of Problem and Remedial Action Taken.\*

Compressor mechanic was performing maintenance on the compressor and had bled the pressure by opening the fuel gas scrubber drain valve. When he started the compressor after finishing maintenance the drain valve was left open. This caused gas to release through the open valve until it was discovered the next day. The drain valve was closed and the release was stopped.

Describe Area Affected and Cleanup Action Taken.\*

The gas released dissipated into the atmosphere so no clean-up action was possible.
