

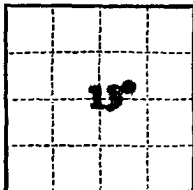

DETAILS OF WORK

SEP 23 1963

Sept 23  
Packed water and tubing. Run labor retrievable packer on 120' section of 2" ERT tubing, set at 3100' RT. Rigged up Russell and packed hole. Pumped to formation with 65 lb at 4500 psi and 10 RT. Sandstream with 25,000' sand and 750' Monte Vista II in 15,000 psi. oil and 40 tons (200 lbs) of carbon dioxide. Pressured with 15 lb and 60, minutes. Treating pressure decreased from 4700 psi at start of treatment to 3600 psi at end of treatment. Average injection rate 2 RT. Pressure shot in pressure 2200 psi. Discontinued at 9:30 on 9-23-63.
