On November 22, 1960 you wrote a letter to this office requesting plugging instructions for Sinclair Santa Fe 103 Miguel, SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 20-16N-6W. You stated that upon receipt of plugging instructions, Form C-102 would be filed outlining the procedure to be followed. On December 6, 1960 we replied to your letter, setting out plugging instructions but have never received Form C-102 which you mentioned you would file nor have we been notified whether the well has been plugged.

Our records also reflect that on January 13, 1961 Form C-102 was filed indicating your intention to plug your #1 Santa Fe 181 Star Lake well in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 13-19N-6W. The plugging plan was approved on January 13, 1961. We have never received Form C-103 showing that the plugging was accomplished as intended.

Will you please see that the above matters are given immediate attention so that we may close our files on these wells.

We have received your letters dated February 16 and 18, 1960, with reference to the above-captioned wells and wish to advise as follows:

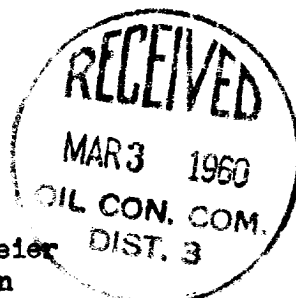
Santa Fe 103 Miguel. This well has been held in a temporarily abandoned status pending further development in the immediate area.
