We have your letter regarding the two Douglas Corporation wells in Township 19 North Range 5 West which your company has acquired.

We have made copies of all forms from the file on these two wells and are mailing them to you.

The only delinquency regarding the two wells at the present time is failure to file gas-oil ratio tests on Form C-116, a supply of which we are enclosing. We are also enclosing a supply of Form C-110, which is our Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport form. This should be filed in quadruplicate on each well showing the Gaddis Mining Company as the new operator. Please give the date of transfer in the "Remarks" Column. The wells at the present time do not have an assigned oil allowable. Upon receipt of a gas-oil ratio test an allowable will be assigned.

Your letter of April 28, 1960, addressed to the Douglas Corporation, pertaining to the above-captioned matter, has been forwarded to us for action.

This is to advise you that assignments, Designation of Operator, Bonds, etc. are now being prepared, naming us as Operator of the 1-17 Indian and other properties in the Star Lake Area, formerly operated by Douglas Corporation.

The #1-17 Indian Well has been shut down for several months, and we are just now beginning operations to clean out the well and place it on production again. We would appreciate it if you could grant us an extension of time in which to perform the Gas-Oil Ratio Test.

From the files turned over to us by Douglas Corporation, we are unable to determine exactly what reports have been submitted on this well and what reports are due or overdue. We would appreciate it if you would advise us what reports are overdue on this well or on the Federal 4-8 Well on Section 8, 19N, 5W, which we are also going to operate as soon as the necessary paper work can be accomplished. Since this will be our first operation in New Mexico, we would appreciate it if you could send us a supply of the required reporting forms, along with any published instructions or Regulations pertaining thereto.
