Re: Abandonment and Plugging of Wells

Dear Mr. Lamar:

Rules 201 and 202 of our Rules and Regulations set out the procedure for plugging and abandoning wells.

The above mentioned rules require: 1. A notice of intention to plug and abandon, 2. A subsequent notice of abandonment, and 3. Form C-105, Well Completion and Recompletion Report and Well Log.

The Lamar Trucking, Inc. State #1 well located 495 FNL, 495 FWL of Section 28 Township 20 North, Range 9 West has not been plugged and abandoned in compliance with the formentioned rules.

The only report received in this office since the intention to Drill is a letter dated December 26, 1962.

The intention to Plug and Abandon should be accompanied by the Form C-105 showing all well data.

If the well has not been properly plugged and abandoned prior to July 1, 1966, a case will be called before the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission to allow the operator to show why the well should not be plugged and abandoned.

We desire to witness the plugging operations. Please advise this office in writing of the date and time that plugging operations will begin.

NOW, on this 9th day of January, 1967, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the Attorney for the Commission stated at the hearing that the subject well had been plugged prior to the hearing in accordance with a Commission-approved plugging program and moved to dismiss the case.

(3) That Case No. 3441 should be dismissed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That Case No. 3441 is hereby dismissed.

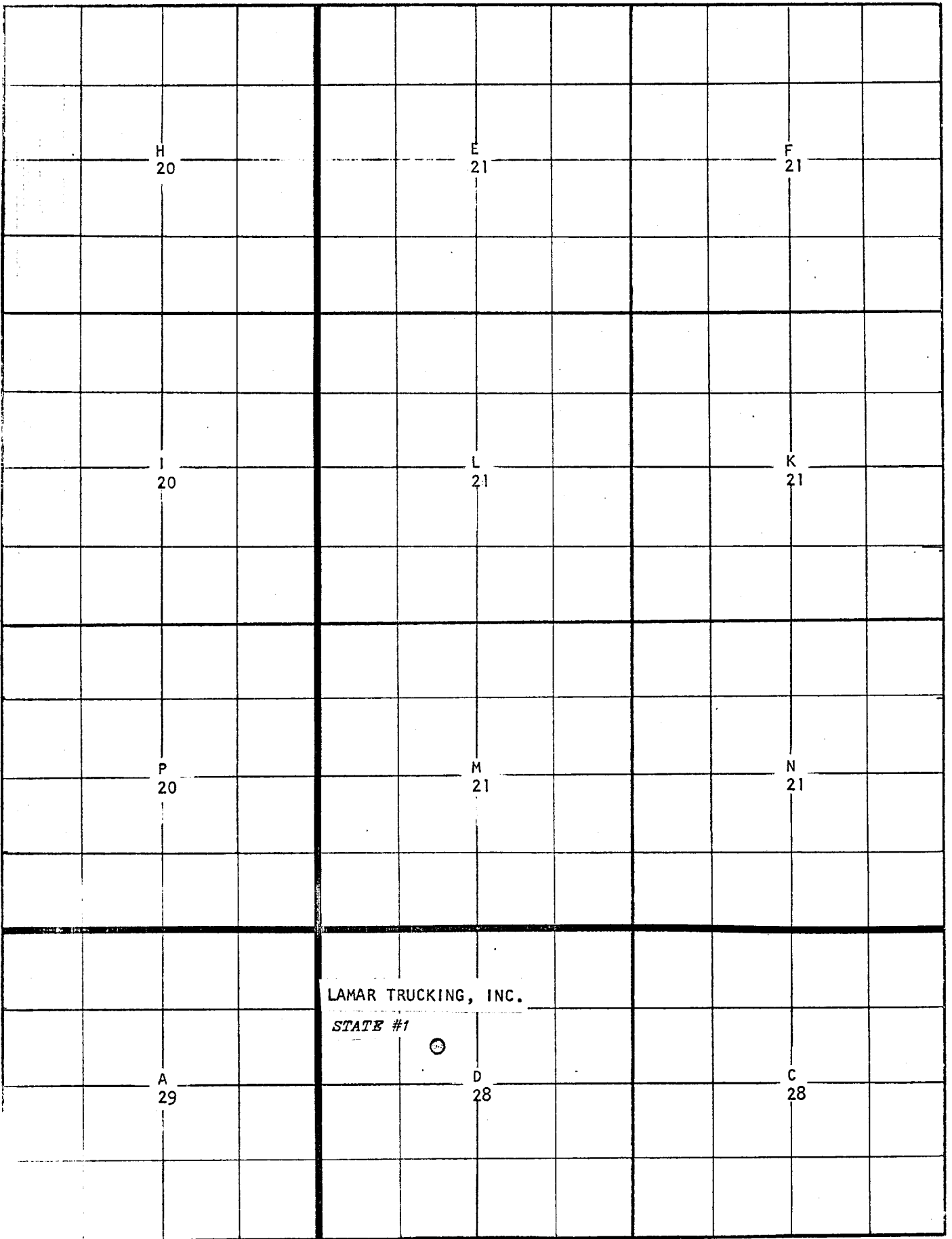
