ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701, Tenneco Oil Company has made application to the Commission on April 19, 1972, for permission to expand its Upper Hospah Unit Water Flood Project in the South Hospah Upper Sand Oil Fool, McKinley County, New Mexico.

NOW, on this 4th day of May, 1972, the Secretary-Director finds:

- 1. That application has been filed in due form.
- That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- 3. That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701.
- 4. That the proposed injection wells are eligible for conversion to water injection under the terms of Rule 701.
- 5. That the proposed expansion of the above-referenced water flood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
 - 6. That the application should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant, Tenneco Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Upper Hospah formation through the following described wells for purposes of secondary recovery, to wit:

No. 52 located in Unit C, both in

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That the applicant shall inject water through tubing with packers set at approximately 1590 feet in said wells.
