Lone Pine Dakota D Pool
Prevent Gas Flaring

Dear Mr. Denman,

By way of review, NFO Exception #3-52 was issued by this office on July 31, 1972 approving the flaring of gas from Hanson #22 well until September 30, 1972. Upon expiration of this exception I contacted you and you responded by letter dated October 24, 1972 stating that gas from the Hanson #22 had been connected to the Hospah and South Hospah fuel sustems and that no gas was being flared from the well. From recent communication with you it is my understanding that you now have excess gas going into this fuel system and the Hanson #22 well is the source of the excess gas which is being flared.

It is also my understanding that negotiations have been in progress for several months between Tesoro and Tenneco Oil Company toward the end of taking this well into Tenneco's Lone Pine Dakota D Unit. This would enable Tenneco to gather gas from this well and reinject it in their pressure maintenance project in the unit.

The New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission does not currently recommissed delays in negotiations as a justifiable reason for flaring of gas.

I am therefore directing that this well be shut in immediately and be left shut in until such time as beneficial use can be made of the produced gas or until it can be reinjected and saved.
