By authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 104 FI of the Division Rules and Regulations, the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.







REQUEST FOR UNORTHODOX LOCATION FOR BOLACK INERALS COMPANY - BOLACK "E" #4-R PICTURED CLIFFS WELL SE/4 SEC. 1, T23N, R6W, RIO ARRIBA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO

The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division spacing regulations for a standard location for A pictured cliffs gas well in the San Juan Basin (which the proposed Bolack "E" #4-R well is) requires a location within a 200 foot square in the SE/4 (the preferred geological location) which is 790 ft. to 990 feet from the south and east lines of the section.


- 2. On December 16, 1983, W. R. Speer, a consulting geologist, and F. B. Kerr, a registered professional engineer and land surveyor, attempted to stake a location for the Bolack "E" #4-R Well at a location 1890' from the south line and 790' from the east line. However, upon running it, it was found that the stake fell on a solid sandstone ledge in the bottom of a major drainage arroyo. The arroyo dropped off of a mesa into the canyon with vertical cliffs of some 100 ft. height only about 200 yards east of the stake. It would be virtually impossible to build a location large enough to accomodate even a small rig due to the terrain and given the environmental considerations.
- Accordingly, two alternate locations were staked, both of which meet Federal spacing requirements, but are unorthodox by NMOCD standards. The first was placed at the base of the canyon cliffs in a position giving enough room to building the appropriate drill pad. It fell 1890 feet from the south line, but only 410 feet from the east line, some 380' too close to the eastern boundary of the section by NMOCD requirements. In addition, the eastern boundary is also the Jicarilla Apache Indian Reservation boundary. This boundary is fenced and would require cutting and installation of a cattleguard to reach the Also, to gain access to this location would require location. construction of approximately 1500 feet of road well hookup would also require Reservation, and the additional 1000 ft. of pipeline right-of-way to be located on Because of the difficulties in the Reservation. Jicarilla Apache Indian approval for this construction, and the likelihood the Tribe would oppose the unorthodox location, another location on the top of the mesa was staked.
- 4. The second alternate location located 2040 feet from the south line and 810 feet from the east line was staked as the most reasonable location to remain as close to the legal requirements as possible, while coping with the topographic and terrain problems. In addition, this location was located to give ready access to the existing pipeline and pipeline road which run to the abandoned Bolack "E" #4 Well only 250 feet west of the proposed location.
- 5. It is requested that the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division administratively approve this unorthdox well location for the topographic reasons detailed above.


