

THE APPLICATION OF PETRO-LEWIS
CORPORATION FOR A SALT WATER
DISPOSAL WELL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) Petro-Lewis Corporation, made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on August 6, 1973, for permission to complete for salt water disposal its Federal Media Well No. 3 located in Unit B of Section 22, Township 19 North, Range 3 West, NMPM, Sandoval County, New Mexico.

The Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) of the Commission Rules and Regulations;
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators, surface owners, and the New Mexico State Engineer Office have been duly notified; and
3. That the applicant has presented satisfactory evidence that all requirements prescribed in Rule 701 (C) will be met.
4. That no objections have been received within the waiting period prescribed by said rule.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Petro-Lewis Corporation, is hereby authorized to complete its Federal Media Well No. 3 located in Unit B of Section 22, Township 19 North, Range 3 West, NMPM, Sandoval County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the injection of salt water for disposal purposes into the Gallup formation at approximately 2826 feet to approximately 2954 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after notice and hearing, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted in the interest of conservation. That applicant shall submit monthly reports of the disposal operation in accordance with Rules 704 and 1120 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

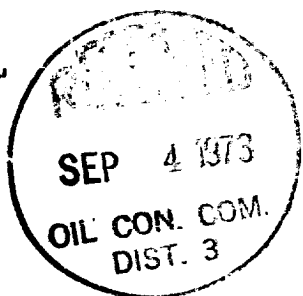

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE NEW MEXICO CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 101 (C) of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission, the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission has received an application for a permit to dispose of salt water disposal in Unit B of Section 13, Township 19 North, Range 3 West, Sandoval County, New Mexico.

The Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 101 (C) of the Commission Rules and Regulations;
 2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators, surface owners, and the New Mexico State Engineer Office have been duly notified; and
 3. That the applicant has presented satisfactory evidence that all requirements prescribed in Rule 101 (C) will be met.
4. That no objections have been received within the waiting period prescribed by said rule.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, New Mexico Oil Conservation, is hereby authorized to complete the Federal Well No. 3 located in Unit B of Section 13, Township 19 North, Range 3 West, Sandoval County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the injection of salt water for disposal purposes into the Gallup formation at approximately 10,000 feet to approximately 10,500 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of said cases is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may be necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after notice and hearing, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted in the interest of conservation. That applicant shall submit monthly reports of disposal operation in accordance with Rules 104 and 110 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.
