Gentlemen:

Returned herewith unapproved is your request to temporarily abandon well No. 1 Navajo 9-22-7, sec. 9, T. 22 N., R. 7 W., Sandoval County, New Mexico, lease N00-C-14-20-5592. To place this well in an acceptable status for temporary abandonment, it is necessary to place a bridge plug no more than 50 feet above the upper most perforation. If temporary abandonment is approved, it will be for one year and at the end of that time you are requested to show cause why the well should not be plugged and abandoned.

If you wish to pursue the possible conversion of this well to salt water disposal, then you are required to file a notice of intent including therein your proposed actions, the anticipated time that the work will be done, and a copy of your letter requesting a NMOC hearing. If you wish to pursue temporary abandonment, then you are required to resubmit a sundry notice incorporating the aforementioned bridge plug. In any case, one or the other notices must be received in this office within 30 days from the date of this letter.

In the future please be advised sundry notices on Federal and Indian wells must be filed with this office and a minimum of five copies submitted.
