Requirements regarding Well
Naming and Numbering

Dear Sir:

We have received copies of Federal Application for Permit to Drill for two wells in 18N-3W. One you have designated as the #1-34 Myra in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 34-18N-3W. You had previously filed notices for wells designated as the #1 Myra and #2 Myra in Section 27. The Commission does not presently accept well numbers which contain section or subdivision numbers as part of the well number; therefore it will be necessary that the well in Section 34 be renumbered and I presume that you would wish to call it the #3 Myra. I am returning all copies of these notices to you in order that they may be corrected. Please note that we have also rearranged the name and number information on the form. The "Farm or Lease Name" should be Myra and the well number blank should contain no information other than the well number. Please return both copies to this office when they have been corrected.

We would like to further explain Oil Commission requirements regarding naming and numbering of wells on basic leases in oil pools. All wells on a basic lease or on a tract which may legally be produced into a common tankage should be identified with the same name and numbered in a logical, non-repetitive fashion; however wells located on two or more basic leases should not be identified by the same name. When a lease line is crossed, please choose a new lease name. We do not have the basic lease information in regard to your acreage and we are unable to determine whether or not you have done this correctly.
