Verbal approval was given by Steve Mason (RLM) in a telephone conversation with Dan Lockwood (CPC) in 5-15-84 to attempt to cover the Ojo Alamo (567'-847') and the Fruitland (847'-1,000') Formations with cement by pumping down behind the 7" casing at surface. Champlin was unable to bring cement up over the two zones due to severe lost circulation problems. It was decided that it would be safer to pump down the backside than perforate the 7" casing and squeeze cement the two zones.

Instructions

General: This form is designed for submitting proposals to perform certain well operations, and reports of such operations when completed, as indicated, on Federal and Indian lands pursuant to applicable Federal law and regulations, and, if approved or accepted by any State, on all lands in such State, pursuant to applicable State law and regulations. Any necessary special instructions concerning the use of this form and the number of copies to be submitted, particularly with regard to local, area, or regional procedures and practices, either are shown below or will be issued by, or may be obtained from, the local Federal and/or State office.

Item 4: If there are no applicable State requirements, locations on Federal or Indian land should be described in accordance with Federal requirements. Consult local State or Federal office for specific instructions.
