Gentlemen:

In completing our Chaco Unit No. 3 in the SW/NE Section 21, Township 23 North, Range 8 West, San Juan County, New Mexico we bought and used 1560 barrels of crude oil from British American Oil Company (Bisti Field) to frac the well.

The well has produced 1164 barrels of this and is now shut-in as of 5:00 A. M. September 17, 1956, due to shortage of tank storage on the lease. This leaves a total of 396 barrels of load oil to be produced before the well can be potentialized.

We request permission to sell this 1560 barrels or enough to potential the well so that forms C-104 and C-110 can be filled out on the well. We have 500 barrels of permanent storage on the lease.

El Paso Products Company, Bloomfield, New Mexico will be the authorized transporter of oil from this lease.

The first 24 hours production after the load oil is recovered should be between 100 and 150 barrels and we should have the well potentialized by September 30, 1956, provided tank room is available.
