I have been forwarded a copy of an application which you have made for an unorthodox location to be drilled in the NEL Section 8-23N-9W, San Juan County, New Mexico.

At present Rule 104 is being re-written for the San Juan Basin in such a manner that your location, being an oil prospect would no longer be unorthodox. The new rule as written will allow an oil wildcat to be located within 330 feet of the 40-acre boundaries.

We have, therefore, called the United States Geological Survey that your location as staked meets the requirements of the spacing rules.

Genillemen:

We are today filing with Ar. P. T. McGrath, District Engineer, 0. S. Geological Survey, Farmington, New Mexico, a Motice of Intention to Drill (Federal form 9-331B) accompanied by Well Location Plat (your form 0-128), concerning the drilling of a test wildcat well located 1990 ft. from N. line and 1875 ft. from M. line of Sec. 8, T-23F, R-9W, San Juan County, New Mexico. The wrill site is part of an Indian Allotted tract of land. We understand that the USOS will transmit to you sufficient copies of this Notice and Plat to meet your requirements.

This test is planned primarily to explore the oil possibilities of the Gallup Sandstone Formation, and has therefore been located on a forty-acre tract (SEQNEZ of Sec. 8). As no understand your Rule 104, section (b), this constitutes an unorthodox location in that the well is located less than 990 feet from the outer boundary lines of the tract or which it is to be drilled.

On the grounds, therefore, that our proposed wilblest test is to be drilled to test a known oil-producing norizon we ask that you consider this letter as our application for an exception to your rule that wildcat wells in San Juan County shall be located 990 feet from the outer boundary lines of the drilling tract. We respectfully request that you approve the Motice of Intension to Drill (above described) for the wildcat test well as now located.

Due to the topographical conditions of the drilling site it was necessary to stake the location as shown on the plat, rather than an exact 1980 feet from both the north and east lines of Dection 6.

We own the oil and gas lease covering all of the HA, of Secti 8-23F-97.
