Open burning is necessary to prevent contamination of surface waters and is permitted pursuant to AQCR 301.F
 This permit is approved for the following dates: 6-11-98 to 6-20-98
 and is subject to the following conditions:

1. All burning must take place during the time period of three hours after sunrise to one hour before sunset.
2. The wind direction at the site of burning must be such that the smoke will generally be carried away from public roads and areas of human habitation.
3. All burning will cease when atmospheric conditions are such that an air stagnation advisory is issued for your area by the U.S. Weather Service.
4. All material to be burned shall be as dry as possible and amount of dirt must be minimized on material being burned.
5. No natural or synthetic rubber products or petroleum products shall be burned.
6. All applicable restrictions, codes and ordinances (e.g., fire codes or ordinances), whether temporary or permanent, of other governmental bodies must be complied with.
7. Other conditions:

Approved with fire department personnel must be notified prior to burning
 The Department reserves the right to cancel this permit at any time if the public interest so warrants it. If such action occurs, any alternative method of disposal must be used. The holder of this permit is therefore cautioned and charged that he/she, and he/she alone, assumes full responsibility to exercise the utmost care and judgment before setting any fires. The Environment Department hereby disclaims any and all liability of itself or its agents that might be incurred by petitioner's acts.
