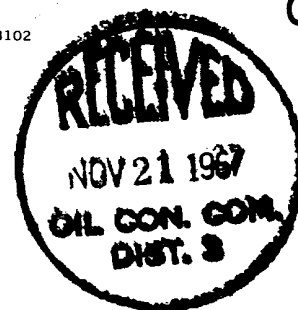


Enclosed please find:

The suggested pool name is Akah Nez, which means "Tall Oil" or "Oil in the Mountains". The Navajo "J" No. 1 is located in the Chuska Mountains of the Navajo Reservation, at an elevation in excess of 9100'. This pool name has been suggested by the Minerals Supervisor of the Navajo Tribe.
