

Dear Mr. Hunt:

Since receiving your letter of January 10, 1964 regarding classification of the above well I have studied the well logs of this and surrounding wells as well as the well log from the #1 Schmitz, which was the original well completed in the zone in question. It is obvious that the #2 Schmitz is not completed in the Pictured Cliffs zone but in the Torreon Puerco which is also the producing zone in the #1 Schmitz well. As you have mentioned in your letter this zone is presently un-prorated and the amount of gas you sell will be determined by your contractual arrangements with the purchasing pipeline.

I will be interested to learn if production from this well is merely a localized condition or whether the producing area may be of significant size. I will appreciate receiving any further information which you determine regarding this zone. I would particularly appreciate receiving any core analysis information.
