This letter is written in confirmation of our long distance telephone conversation of this date at which time we discussed our engaging your services for the purpose of completing the plugging of one well drilled by Jim Storms of Pampa, Texas, and the cleaning up of the area around another well drilled by Mr. Storms. Your fee of \$100 per day plus mileage is acceptable to us and it is our understanding that it will take approximately two days to complete this work. This letter will serve as your authority to engage the necessary servicing companies to complete the work as discussed and to have them bill us direct.

The well covered by our bond #123335 is the one which has been plugged but needs the area to be cleaned. It is described as Jim Storms' Ghost Ranch Well #1, Unit A, Section 22, Township 24 North, Range 4 East, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

The second well which will require plugging is covered by our bond #311378 and is described as Jim Storms' Ghost Ranch Well #2 located 1980 feet from the North Line and 810 feet from the West Line of Section 22, Township 24 North, Range 4 East, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

It is understood that you will make every effort to keep the expenses of this work as low as possible and that upon completion of the work you will secure the necessary affidavit from Mr. A. R. Kendrick of the Farmington Branch of the Oil Conservation Commission that the work has been completed and is acceptable to the Commission.
