Dear Ms. Keeshan:

Upon review of the NMOCD files of the referenced injection well, I find that it has been temporarily abandoned since January, 1978. NMOCD Rule 705.B.l. states that whenever there is a continuous six-month period of non-injection into any injection project or well, such project or well shall be considered abandoned, and the authority for injection shall automatically terminate ipso facto. This letter will serve as notice that your authority to inject into the referenced well has terminated. If, at some later date, you wish to reinject into this well, it will be necessary to submit a new application (Form C-108) to the Division.

NMOCD Rule 705.A. states in part that no injection well may be temporarily abandoned for more than six months unless the injection interval has been isolated by use of cement or a bridge plug. In order to comply with NMOCD Rule 705.A. you are hereby directed to initiate one of the following actions within six months:

- (1) Return the well to active status.
- (2) Plug and abandon the well or place a cement bridge plug above the injection interval.
- (3) File a workover or plugging plan and schedule with the appropriate Division district office.
- (4) File a request for exception to Rule 705.A. with the Division Director in Santa Fe.
