Dear Mr. Utz:

On April 29, 1965, I wrote you regarding overproduction on the Redfern No. 2 Largo Spur well in the Devils Fork Gallup Pool. The Volumetric Withdrawal Adjustment Schedule for the period August 1, 1964 through January 31, 1965, showed the overproduction status of the Redfern No. 2 Largo Spur well as 167,881 Mcf at the beginning of the period. By the end of the period the overproduction had increased to 215,794 Mcf.

In our discussion of this matter, it was my understanding that this well was to be shut-in and left shut-in until it was brought back into the requirements of the pool rules whereby a well is allowed to overproduce no more than three times its current month's allowable. I note that the well was produced in August, October, and November of 1965. I have not checked the six months prior to August, but it is very probable that additional production occurred within this time also.

Please advise me why this well is continuously allowed to produce in violation of the pool rules.

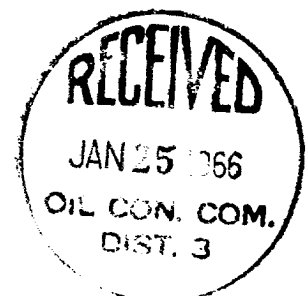
