

THE APPLICATION OF GULF OIL CORPORATION FOR PERMISSION TO EFFECT DUAL COMPLETION OF ITS APACHE-FEDERAL WELL NO. 9 LOCATED IN THE NW/4 NW/4 OF SECTION 17, TOWNSHIP 24 NORTH, RANGE 5 WEST, NMPM, RIO ARRIBA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO PERMIT THE PRODUCTION OF OIL FROM THE GALLUP FORMATION ADJACENT TO THE OTERO-GALLUP OIL POOL AND THE PRODUCTION OF GAS FROM THE BASIN-DAKOTA POOL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Gulf Oil Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 24, 1960, for permission to dually complete its Apache-Federal Well No. 9 located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 17, Township 24 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Gallup formation adjacent to the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 21st day of November, 1960, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Gulf Oil Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Apache-Federal Well No. 9 located in the NW/4 NW/4 of Section 17, Township 24 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Gallup formation adjacent to the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Gulf Oil Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 24, 1953, for permission to dual complete the Apache-Federal Well No. 9 located in the NW 1/4 of Section 17, Township 13 North, Range 2 West, NMMN, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Gallup formation adjacent to the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 21st day of November, 1953, the Secretary-Inspector finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Conservation Rules and Regulations
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all questions of oil and gas acreage have been duly resolved
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor unfair competitive practices
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consistent with good conservation practices

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Gulf Oil Corporation, do and the same is hereby authorized to dual complete the Apache-Federal Well No. 9 located in the NW 1/4 of Section 17, Township 13 North, Range 2 West, NMMN, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of oil from the Gallup formation adjacent to the Otero-Gallup Oil Pool and the production of gas from the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

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PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.

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PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take backer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular strip-zone production in the interests of conservation.
