Gentlemen:

A recent Commission Order extended the Ballard Pictured Cliffs Gas Pool to include areas previously included in the Otero and Canyon Largo Pictured Cliffs Pools. The order stipulates that no well will be granted an allowable without a properly executed Form C-128 "Acreage Dedication Plat" being on file which shows the correct acreage to be dedicated to each well. This plat must be signed by an operator's representative testifying to the ownership of the acreage in the dedicated area.

In checking our files we find that revised plats are needed on the following well operated by your Company in this area:

Skelly #1 Jicarilla "B", H-6-24N-5W

As the effective date of the pool extension is May 1, 1959 it will be necessary that we have these plats immediately in order that the well may be given a proper allowable. If you have any questions in the matter please contact us.

1. The first step in the process of the investigation is the identification of the problem. This is done by the investigator who is responsible for the study. The next step is the formulation of a hypothesis, which is a statement that can be tested. The third step is the design of the study, which involves the selection of the subjects, the measurement of the variables, and the control of the extraneous variables. The fourth step is the collection of data, which is done by the investigator or by a trained observer. The fifth step is the analysis of the data, which is done by the investigator or by a computer. The sixth step is the interpretation of the results, which is done by the investigator. The final step is the reporting of the results, which is done by the investigator or by a journal.
