By letters dated March 14, 1978, and October 20, 1977, this office requested Sundry Notice, form 9-331, outlining your plans to commence drilling operations on well No. 9 Burro Canyon, located in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 16, T. 24 N., R. 4 W., NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, on Jicarilla Contract No. 363.
