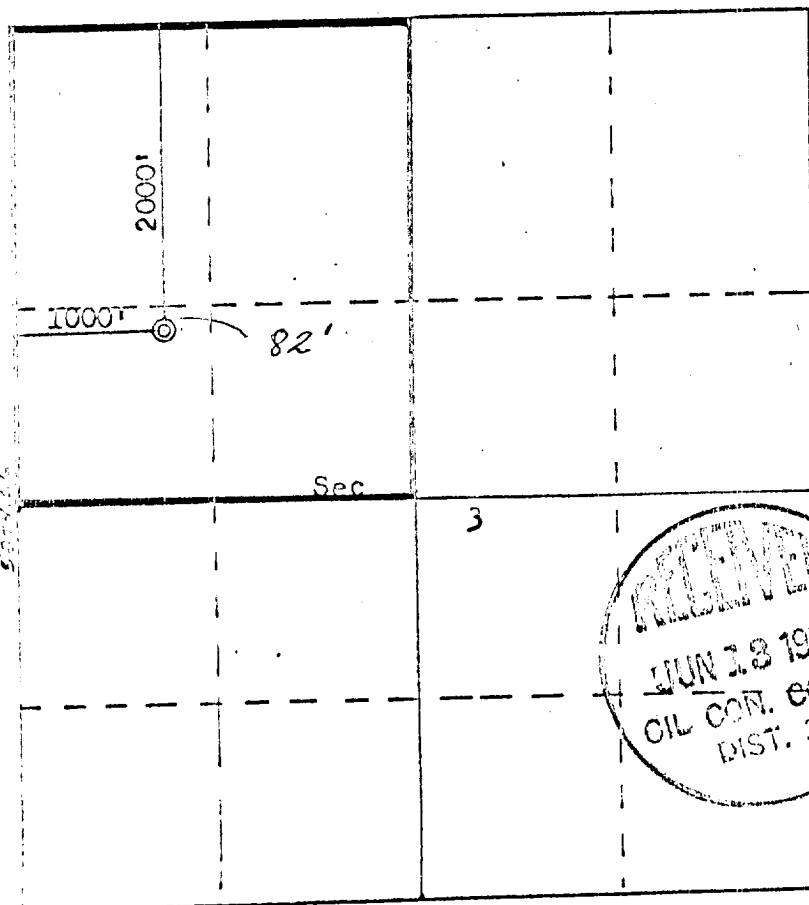

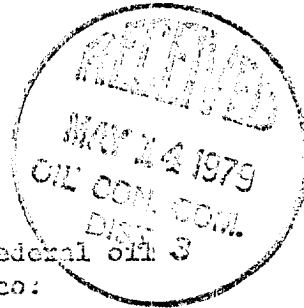

This office has waited for you to rationalize well numbers, locations, and other pertinent information concerning these wells. Well files have become chaotic and it is necessary to start anew.

Approval of Applications for Permit to Drill is rescinded this date and applications are returned herewith. Subsequent drilling operations without approval will be in violation of Title 30 CFR 221.21(b) and will be subject to assessment of liquidated damages.

If at some later date you decide to drill these wells, it will be necessary to submit new applications. To minimize surface disturbance, new applications should be for wells located on well pads already constructed, and be filed with correct survey plats. Unorthodox locations will need approval by the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division.

If you do not plan to drill these wells, access roads and well pads will need to be restored to the satisfaction of the Bureau of Land Management, or, if appropriate, the private surface owner.
