The vegetation is sagebrush, snakeweed (<u>Gutierrizia sarothrae</u>), blue grama, various herbs, and occasional pinyon and juniper trees. The access road proceeds southwest approximately 800 feet, through a pinyon grove to the well location.

Cultural Resources: No cultural resources were noted.

Cultural Resources: One large (50mm x 20mm x 8mm) chalcedony flake was found 200 feet north of the well location in a small erosional gully. Upon further inspection no further artifacts or features were located.

Cultural Significance: The flake appears to be derived from down-slope washing.

Recommendations: Archaeological clearance is recommended.
