Dear Mr. Sears:

Forms C-104, Request for Allowable, and C-110, Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Oil and Natural Gas, for subject well are being held in this office for the following provisions:

1. That the string of $5\frac{1}{2}$ " conductor casing be cemented as per Rule 107, or that approval for a "slim-hole" completion be obtained and sufficient cement used to prevent any transfer of gas or liquids from one zone to another.
2. Date first new oil produced to tanks after cleaning out of fracture oil.
3. Form C-128, showing 80 acres dedication as per Order R-1069-E, Rule 2.

No-flare provisions apply to subject well identical to the #1-27 Navajo.

Any production prior to the approval of Forms C-104 and C-110 shall be illegal oil.
