DETAILS OF WORK

January 13, 1956. Sounded well.

January 14, 1956. After drilling to 330' in 7-7/8" hole with rotary rig, reamed 12-1/4" hole to 266'. Cemented 10 joints (250') of 9-5/8" O.D. 36# casing at 259' RKB with 70 sacks cement, mixed 1:1 with stratacrete and 1/2 gal, followed by 80 sacks neat cement.

Circulated cement to surface.

Will continue drilling after cement sets.
