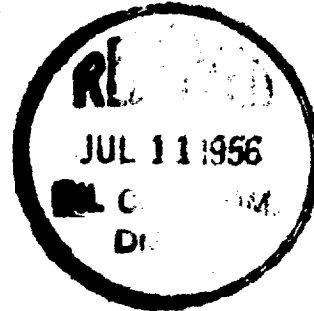

Gentlemen:

Reference is made to your application for approval of an unorthodox well location for your Jicarilla "N" Well No. 3-5 to be located 1690 feet from the South line and 730 feet from the West line and in the SE/4 SW/4 of Section 5, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, Tapacito Pictured Cliffs Gas Pool, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

It is our understanding that this unorthodox well location is based upon extreme topographic conditions in the SW/4 of said section.

Inasmuch as there are no other offset operators, it is possible for immediate approval to be granted.
