By letter of March 3, 1962 concerning your well No. 1 Intex 5, located in the SE1/4 sec. 5, T. 26 N., R. 1 E., Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, this office agreed to allow you a reasonable length of time in which to check the producing capabilities of the well before you were required to plug off the Greenhorn and Graneros zones. As a time considerably exceeding the 3 to 6 month period as stated in the previous letter has elapsed we are requesting that the lower zones be plugged off.

Due to adverse weather and the road conditions in the area, you will be allowed 6 months from the date of this letter to complete the plugging operation. Please contact this office prior to commencing any operations on the well.

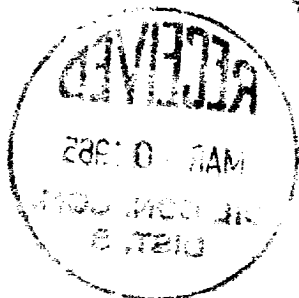
