**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on March 2, 1964, for permission to dually complete its Hoyt Well No. 1-5 located in Unit H of Section 5, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Gallup Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 23rd day of March, 1964, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Hoyt Well No. 1-5 located in Unit H of Section 5, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an undesignated Gallup Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 113-A, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on or March 2, 1964, for permission to drill a well in the East-Gas Pool, located in East B of Section 5, Township 20 North, Range 4 West, S.W. 1/4, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an underground oil and gas bearing formation.

Now, on this first day of March, 1964, the Secretary of the Commission:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 113-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been furnished that all operators of oil and gas wells in the area have been duly notified;
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule;
- (4) That the proposed well completion will not be made not impair conservative rights;
- (5) That the maximum of the proposed well depth and location and completion with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Consolidated Oil & Gas, Inc., do and the same is hereby authorized to drill a well in the East-Gas Pool, located in East B of Section 5, Township 20 North, Range 4 West, S.W. 1/4, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from an underground oil and gas bearing formation through a well in the East-Gas Pool.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 113-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that applicant shall make every effort to prevent leakage from completion and especially the latter part of the well, and shall immediately report to the Commission any such leakage.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That completion of this well be completed for the early of such further order as the Commission may deem necessary.
