

THE APPLICATION OF PAN AMERICAN PETROLEUM  
CORPORATION FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1798



ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Pan American Petroleum Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on November 16, 1967, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 102 Well No. 9 located in Unit G of Section 4, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Gallup Formation and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 4th day of December, 1967, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 102 Well No. 9 located in Unit G of Section 4, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Gallup Formation and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

THE APPLICATION OF THE AMERICAN PETROLEUM CORPORATION FOR A LEASE CONTRACT.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Public Law 85-625, the American Petroleum Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on November 18, 1961, for permission to drill a well in the U.S. Oil Lease 102 Well No. 1 located in Block 1 of Section 36, Township 35 North, Range 4 West, NMP, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Gas-Formation and the Basin-Nakota Pool.

And, on this 15th day of December, 1961, the Commission ordered that:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.
- (2) That satisfactory information has been furnished by the operator of oil and gas wells in the vicinity of the well.
- (3) That no objections have been received within the time period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed well completion will not cause any or impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed well completion are satisfactory and consistent with good operating practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant hereby, for and to the benefit of the well and the formation hereby authorized to be drilled, do hereby agree to pay to the State of New Mexico, for the use of the State, a royalty of 10% of the net proceeds from the sale of gas produced from the well, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Gas-Formation and the Basin-Nakota Pool through the well.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112.

RECORDED HEREIN. That applicant shall make payment of the royalty upon completion and annually thereafter during the term of the well for the Basin-Nakota Pool.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

That production of this lease is hereby authorized and the Secretary of the Commission may determine the amount of gas to be produced from the well.
