It is understood that this unit is to be dedicated to your "N" well No. 12-6 located in the NW/4 NW/4 of said Section 6.

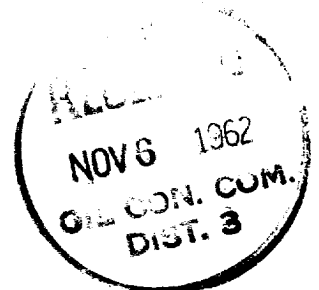
