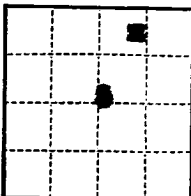

Shovel to an cut & up 25 in then pump leaving 10 in in csg. IN 1400'. Pump press 4000-5000. Run. Final & Sealing 2000'. Released press after 15 min & pulled only test. Shovel cut out inside csg. Pump to pad & Run.
