ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION



Under the provisions of Rule 112-A (c) Occidental Petroleum Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on April 21, 1960, for permission to dually complete its West Well No. 1-6 located in the NE/4 NE/4 of Section 6, Township 26 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde and the production of gas from the South Blanco-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 24th day of May, 1960, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Sub-section 'c' of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Occidental Petroleum Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its West Well No. 1-6 located in the NE/4 NE/4 of Section 6, Township 26 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas from the Blanco-Mesaverde and the production of gas from the South Blanco-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing, set at 2510 feet and at 7449 feet respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That at any time the subject well is being worked over, every reasonable effort shall be made to remove the string of tubing which has been dropped into the well, and the Mesaverde tubing set in compliance with Rule 107 (d).

New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of gas in the
Blanco-Messaverde and the production of gas from the South Blanco-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 14th day of May, 1960, the Secretary-Executive Order under

- (1) That application was filed under the provisions of Rule
section 107 of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators
of offset acreage have been duly notified, and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as
prescribed by said rule;
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor in any
correlative rights;
- (5) That the advantages of the proposed dual completion are feasible and
consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Confidential Petroleum Corporation, be and
the same is hereby authorized to drill and operate its West Well No. 1-6 located
in the NE 1/4 of Section 6, Township 25 North, Range 5 West, Range 5 West, Range 5 West,
Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the production of
gas from the Blanco-Messaverde and the production of gas from the South Blanco-
Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing, set at 2415 feet and at 2445 feet
respectively.

PROVIDED HOWEVER,

That as soon as the subject well is being
worked over, every reasonable effort shall be made to remove the string of
tubing which has been dropped into the well, and the Messaverde tubing set in
compliance with Rule 107 (b).

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PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Section V, Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the South Blanco-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted and require applicant or its successors and assigns to limit its activities to regular single-zone production in the interests of conservation.
