

THE APPLICATION OF PAN AMERICAN PETROLEUM
CORPORATION FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1771

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Pan American Petroleum Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on May 23, 1967, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 102 Well No. 10 located in Unit D of Section 4, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Gallup formation and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 12th day of June, 1967, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache 102 Well No. 10 located in Unit D of Section 4, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Gallup formation and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 115-A, Pan American Petroleum Corporation make application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on May 23, 1963, for permission to jointly combine all the properties of Unit D of Section 4, Jicarilla Apache 103 Well No. 10 located in Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to bring the gas field from San Juan and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

NOW, on this 15th day of June, 1963, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 115-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, and that administrative information has been provided under Rule 115-A.
- (2) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 115-A.
- (3) That no objections have been received within the period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed unit completion will not cause waste nor impede conservation with basic objective.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the application herein, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, be and the same is hereby authorized to jointly combine all the properties of Unit D of Section 4, Jicarilla Apache 103 Well No. 10 located in Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to bring the gas field from San Juan and the Basin-Dakota Pool through barrels of standard delivery capacity with good conservation basic objective.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that application shall take precedence over any other completion and subsequently transferred pursuant to the Annex.

PROVIDED FURTHER, that application shall take precedence over any other completion and subsequently transferred for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this case is hereby reserved for the entity of such further order as the Commission may deem necessary.
