

THE APPLICATION OF MARATHON OIL  
COMPANY FOR A DUAL COMPLETION.

ORDER NO. MC-1836

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Marathon Oil Company, made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on November 15, 1968, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache Well No. 14 located in Unit M of Section 34, Township 26 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the South Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 5th day of December, 1968, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by said rule.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Marathon Oil Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla Apache Well No. 14 located in Unit M of Section 34, Township 26 North, Range 5 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the South Blanco-Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter during the Annual Deliverability Test Period for the Basin-Dakota Pool.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
BY THE OIL COMPLETION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Washington Oil Company, made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on November 15, 1945, for permission to drill a well in the Apache Well No. 14 located in Unit 1 of Section 34, Township 24 North, Range 3 West, T14N, R3W, Apache County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the South Apache-Permian Oil and Gas Field and the Apache-Permian Oil and Gas Field.

Now, on this 15th day of December, 1945, the Secretary  
Director General

(1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;

(2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operations of the proposed well will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Rules and Regulations;

(3) That no objections have been received within the waiting period as prescribed by the Rules.

(4) That the proposed well completion will not cause waste or undue interference with other wells.

(5) That the completion of the proposed well completion are feasible and consistent with good conservation practices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Washington Oil Company, do and do same as hereby authorized to drill a well in the Apache Well No. 14 located in Unit 1 of Section 34, Township 24 North, Range 3 West, T14N, R3W, Apache County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the South Apache-Permian Oil and Gas Field and the Apache-Permian Oil and Gas Field through a well of the type.

PROVIDED HOWEVER, That applicant shall comply, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That applicant shall comply with the provisions of the Rules and Regulations and shall comply with the provisions of the Rules and Regulations and shall comply with the provisions of the Rules and Regulations.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That completion of this case is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
