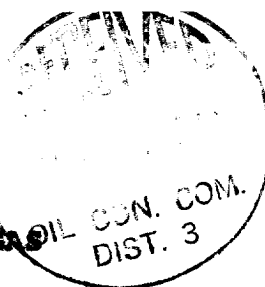


THE APPLICATION OF AZTEC OIL & GAS

ORDER NO. MC-1913

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION**

Under the provisions of Rule 112-A, Aztec Oil & Gas Company made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on January 22, 1970, for permission to dually complete its Jicarilla 101 Well No. 3 located in Unit N of Section 1, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool.

Now, on this 2nd day of February, 1970, the Secretary-Director finds:

- (1) That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 112-A of the Commission's Rules and Regulations;
- (2) That satisfactory information has been provided that all operators of offset acreage have been duly notified; and
- (3) That waivers of objection have been received from offsetting operators and the waiting period as prescribed by said rule may be dispensed with at this time.
- (4) That the proposed dual completion will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (5) That the mechanics of the proposed dual completion are feasible and consonant with good conservation practices.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

That the applicant herein, Aztec Oil & Gas Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to dually complete its Jicarilla 101 Well No. 3 located in Unit N of Section 1, Township 26 North, Range 4 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to produce gas from the Tapacito-Pictured Cliffs Pool and the Basin-Dakota Pool through parallel strings of tubing.

**PROVIDED HOWEVER,** That applicant shall complete, operate, and produce said well in accordance with the provisions of Rule 112-A.

**PROVIDED FURTHER,** That applicant shall take packer-leakage tests upon completion and annually thereafter.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:** That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
