THE APPLICATION OF SHELL OIL
COMPANY FOR A SALT WATER DISPOSAL
WELL.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
OF THE OIL CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) Shell Oil Company, made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission on October 3, 1972, for permission to complete for salt water disposal its Carson Unit 24 Well No. 1 located in Unit A of Section 24, Township 25 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico.

The Secretary-Director finds:

1. That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 701 (C) of the Commission Rules and Regulations;
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators, surface owners, and the New Mexico State Engineer Office have been duly notified; and
3. That the applicant has presented satisfactory evidence that all requirements prescribed in Rule 701 (C) will be met.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant herein, Shell Oil Company, is hereby authorized to complete its Carson Unit 24 Well No. 1 located in Unit (A) of Section 24, Township 25 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, in such a manner as to permit the injection of salt water for disposal purposes into the Menefee and Point Lookout formations at approximately 2835 feet to approximately 3815 feet through tubing with a packer set at approximately 2500 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this cause is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of correlative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after notice and hearing, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted in the interest of conservation. That applicant shall submit monthly reports of the disposal operation in accordance with Rules 704 and 1120 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

The Secretary-Director finds

1. That application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 101 (c) of the Commission Rules and Regulations;
2. That satisfactory information has been provided that all other operators, surface owners and the New Mexico State Engineer Office have been duly notified and
3. That the applicant has provided satisfactory evidence that all requirements prescribed in Rule 101 (c) will be met.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the applicant hereby, Shell Oil Company, is hereby authorized to complete the disposal unit located in Unit A of Section 24, Township 12 North Range 12 West, N.M.P. and Town 12 North Range 12 West, N.M.P. in such a manner as to permit the injection of salt water for disposal purposes into the disposal unit located approximately 1500 feet to approximately 1800 feet from the disposal unit with a water seal of approximately 1500 feet.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That jurisdiction of this case is hereby retained by the Commission for such further order or orders as may seem necessary or convenient for the prevention of waste and/or protection of conservative rights; upon failure of applicant to comply with any requirement of this order after notice and hearing, the Commission may terminate the authority hereby granted in the interest of conservation. That applicant shall submit monthly reports of the disposal operation in accordance with Rules 102 and 110 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.
